Recently, the students in the elementary gifted education math replacement classes in Community Unit School District 95 were given the opportunity to participate in the statewide Math League Contest, sponsored by the Illinois Mathematics League.

The third and fourth grade tests are scored at the school, while the higher grades are sent to the publisher for scoring. Even though the fifth grade students were competing against sixth graders, the District 95 students did very well against the other 194 schools from throughout the state who participated in the annual contest.

Isaac Fox fifth grade student **Jim Andress** was the top award winner for District 95, placing first in the Lake County region, and then placing fifth overall in the state at the sixth grade level. Andress will be recognized during the Isaac Fox School awards assembly on June 2 at the school, 395 W. Cuba Road, Lake Zurich.

In addition to Andress, Middle School North placed 20th overall for grades 6, 7, and 8 in the statewide competition, while the district's fifth grade students placed 24th in the same division.
